New <u>Building Certifier Regulations</u> were released for **comment by 28 October**, and will come into effect soon.

## **Short Term Letting**

The WA Inquiry into short term letting has released its report. The Committee considers short term rentals should be appropriately regulated, according to local conditions. They **recommend a state-wide register** as a powerful tool for LGAs to understand and **manage the impact of short term rentals in their individual communities**.

#### **Building Defects and Flammable Cladding**

NSW Fair Trading reports that the Cladding Strikeforce has set up a support group to assist Local Councils assess non-compliant cladding.

The NSW government continues to resist funding remediation of privately owned buildings despite Victoria's \$600m announcement.

The debate about the fate of Mascot Towers owners continues, with an open letter to the Minister begging for help and distressed owners attending Question Time to hear the government's plans to assist.

One devastated owner has set up a petition asking the Federal Government for a Royal Commission into the Home Building Industry.
